

## **Owen Lamont**

Owen Lamont is Professor of Finance at Yale School of Management, and is a Research Associate at the National Bureau of Economic Research. From 2005 to 2006 he was Senior Associate Dean for Faculty Affairs at Yale School of Management. He obtained a B.A. in Economics and Government from Oberlin College in 1988, and a Ph.D. in Economics from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology in 1994. Before moving to Yale in 2003, he taught at Princeton and the University of Chicago. He has received numerous prizes and awards, including fellowships from the National Science Foundation and the Alfred P. Sloan Foundation. His research is in asset pricing and corporate finance, and has published academic papers on short selling, stock returns, bond returns, closed-end funds, and corporate diversification. At Yale he teaches a course in Behavioral Finance.

As of July 2006, he is on leave from Yale University and working for DKR Fusion Management, LP as Portfolio Manager for the DKR Neutrino Fund.
